

**Addendum to the Erskine Theological Seminary Course Catalog  
Academic Year 2007 - 2008**

**I. Academic Probation:** A student who does not maintain satisfactory work is placed on academic probation. The following regulations apply to academic probation:

1. A student who does not earn at least a cumulative 2.0 (3.0 in the **Th.M. & D.Min.**) grade-point ratio during any semester will be placed on probation.
2. Students on probation must attend all classes unless excused by the professor.
3. The program director and the Dean must approve the academic program of a student on probation.
4. Students on probation are limited to two courses during the probationary semester.
5. A student placed on probation will not be eligible for financial aid during the probationary semester. **In the event of extenuating circumstances involving Seminary error, an override granting eligibility for financial aid may be granted for one semester to any student who has been placed on academic probation. Such overrides must be approved by the Dean.**

**II. Changes in charges for the non-credit course PM 090 Writing For Ministry:**

Effective January 1, 2009, Erskine Seminary will be changing the way it charges students for the non-credit course PM 090 Writing for Ministry. Instead of charging full tuition for that course and then offering those who complete it successfully a tuition waiver for another course, Erskine will begin simply charging a flat fee of \$450 for the Writing for Ministry Course. This will affect all students who take Writing for Ministry in spring 2009 or later.
